In my previous writing, I revealed that the date of Jesus' crucifixion was Passover, 33 A.D.

You will note that Hebrews 1:2 speaks of "these last days", that God speaks to us by His Son in these last days. These is plural, and days is plural, thus signifying that there would yet be more than one day from the time of His crucifixion forward.

2 Peter 3:8 tells us that, to the Lord, one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years are as one day. Paul (the presumed writer of Hebrews) thereby predicted that there'd be at least 2 days, or 2000 years, from Jesus' death to the time He returns with His people, as per Jude 1:14-15.

If that is the timeframe - to the day - when He will return, then He must return to judge the nations in 2033 A.D.

Accounting for this, and accounting also for the "week" of years that remains of Daniel 9:24's "70 weeks", being the period I refer to as "The Time of Jacob's Trouble" (Jeremiah 30:7), which would thus be 7 years, the year prior to the start of that 7-year period would be 2025 A.D.

I believe Jesus will return during the Passover Feast / Feast of Unleavened Bread in 2025 A.D., this return being "the 1st Rapture" (of 3 total), therefore! ~Roger Funk, II

You will also note that there are 2 "days" (of thousands of years) that transpire from Jesus' Passion to His return, and there are thereafter 1000 years of His reign with His saints on the earth (Revelation 20:6). This is referred to in Scripture as the day of the Lord's "rest" (Hebrews 4:3-5, 11).

Hebrews 4:3 states that "the works were finished from the foundation of the world". This pattern is evidenced in the days of creation in Genesis Chapter 1. Let me explain:

Genesis 1:20-22 has the decree of God to bring forth whales and fish in the waters and winged fowl of all kinds in the air above the earth. Genesis 1:23 says that this is "the fifth day" of God's creation.

Genesis 1:24-25 says that God created the beasts of the field and the cattle and every thing that creeps on the earth, and then Genesis 1:26-27 and 1:28 states that God created mankind that same day. Genesis 1:31 then states that this was "the sixth day" of God's creation.

Genesis 2:2 states that God "rested" on "the seventh day" of His creation. This "rest" of God coincides with the 1000-year reign of Christ on the earth along with His people, the saints.

You will note that all that was created on the  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$  days was what was "living", that which had "life" within it – see Genesis 1:20, 21, 24, 26-27, 28, and especially 1:30.

The two days of creation that appertains to "life" that God created is a type and foreshadow of the 2 "last days" after the Passion of Christ Jesus, wherein all mankind has the opportunity to be saved, and thus given "eternal life"! These 2 days of creation are, to the Lord, "as a thousand years" (each), thus foretelling prophetically that there'd be 2000 years from the crucifixion to Jesus' return to judge the nations with His saints!

(This was all revealed to me the night of 12-27-2022 right after I wrote the prior message about Jesus' fulfilling the prophecy of Daniel 9:25-26.)
